## Spatial planning for a better quality of life:

#### How can the quality of life in urban and rural areas be strengthened?

At least since the Covid-19 pandemic, citizens in all European regions have asked themselves the following question: How would I assess my quality of life? Which aspects matter to me for a good quality of life? The answers are very different, depending — for instance — on where the citizens are geographically located in Europe and on whether their life takes place in a rural, urban or cross-border area. This raises a number of specific questions and expectations vis-à-vis policy-makers. It is up to spatial planning to enter into a dialogue with citizens using a variety of tools and methods.

Within the framework of the activities of the ESPON Contact Point in Luxembourg, the Ministry of Energy and Spatial Planning of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg invites you to attend our annual conference on **10 November 2021 from 9:00 to 12:30**.
