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The ESPON 2013 Programme

Role in Structural Funds 2007-2013:

 Support policy development with evidence on European territorial structures, trends, perspectives and policy impacts based on comparable information on regions and cities revealing territorial capital and potentials.

Budget 2007-13:

- 47 mill. Euro

(ERDF 34 mill. Euro and 13 mill. Euro from 31 countries)

Programme priorities:

- P 1: Applied research
- P 2: Targeted analyses based on stakeholder interest
- P 3: Scientific platform and tools
- P 4: Capitalisation



ESPON in motion on applied research (1)

Focus on types of areas and governance

- Cities and urban agglomerations/functionality and competitiveness and cohesion
- Development in different types of rural areas
- Secondary growth poles and territorial development
- European perspective on specific types of territories
- Attractiveness of European regions and cities
- Globalisation and territorial structures and flows
- Territorial cooperation
- Services of general interest



ESPON in motion on applied research (2)

Sectoral focus

- Demography and migratory flows European regions
- Effects of energy prices on regional competitiveness
- Climate change and territorial effects
- Patterns of land use
- Accessibility at regional/local scale in Europe
- Territorial dimension of innovation and knowledge
- European seas and territorial development

Focus on impact assessment

- Territorial impact assessment of sector policies
- Territorial and regional sensitivity of EU directives



New type of ESPON projects

- New approach to project generation and implementation in partnership
- Use of existing ESPON results
- Involving stakeholders and experts/researchers

Objectives

- Evidence and knowledge based on ESPON results for individual regions/larger territories from European perspective
- Usefulness of ESPON results by testing new, experimental and innovative options
- Analytical support and evidence based on ESPON results on thematic priorities for SF Programmes





Specific characteristics, the Stakeholders

- define content of projects
- are involved in TPG selection
- give guidance to targeted analysis
- apply project outputs in practice & disseminate results
 - -> Stakeholders' commitment essential for project's success





Potential benefits for stakeholders

- Enhance the understanding of their larger territorial context
- Make comparisons to other territories, regions and cities
- Provide a European perspective to considerations on opportunities for their territorial development
- Achieve customised & up-to-date information for policy development





A two-step procedure towards targeted analyses

- Submission of expressions of interest (EoI) by stakeholders, approved by ESPON MC
 →EoI are basis for development of project specifications/terms of reference
- Call for proposals/tenders for targeted analysis mainly addressed to research institutes and universities with the necessary analytical capacity to carry out the analysis





Targeted analyses on user demand: Strategy building for types of regions (1)

- The case for agglomeration economies in Europe (Manchester, Barcelona, Dublin and Lyon)
- The development of the islands and cohesion policy (Ministry of Economy and Finance, GR plus 9 stakeholders)
- Cross-border polycentric metropolitan regions (Ministries in CH, LU, BE, DE and FR)
- Success for convergence regions' economies
 (Campania Region plus regions in PO, ES and GR)
- Regional integrated strategies (West-Midlands (UK), Västerbotten (SE), Sealand (DK) and Randstad Flanders Brussels)
- Potential of rural regions (Notodden municipality, Cesis District, North Yorkshire county and Wales)



Targeted analyses on user demand: Strategy building for types of regions (2)

- Polycentric metropolisation in Central Europe (Vienna, Bratislava, Ljubljana and Prague plus Hungary)
- Airports as drivers in peripheral regions (Regions of Savona and Western Greece plus City of Jyveskyla)
- Migration and gender balance in rural regions (Saxony-Anhalt Region plus development agencies of Hungary, Finland and Sweden)
- Smart institutions for territorial development (Ministries of Italy and France)
- Development conditions for Paris, Berlin, Warsaw
 (Cities of Warsaw, Berlin and Paris)



Targeted analyses on user demand: Using methodologies and monitoring for development

- Spatial scenarios for local and regional territories (Regions of Barcelona, Torino and Herault)
- Territorial diversity (Ministries in NO, FI, CH, CY, MT, RO and SE)
- Advanced monitoring of regional R&D (Regions of Tuscany, Catalonia, Andalusia, Alpes Cote d'Azur, Brittany, Ostrobotnia, Lower-Saxony and Flanders)
- Support method for transnational European cooperation (North West Europe Programme)
- Territorial impact assessment (Ministries UK, Portugal and Slovenia)
- Yardsticks for cross-border spatial development (Region Alsace plus 17 cross-border regions)
- Territorial performance monitoring (Flanders, Catalonia, North-Rhine Westphalia, Navarra and Dublin Region)
